




CHOCLATE TRUFLE COOKIES

4 1 ounce squares unsweetened Chocolate chopped

1 cup semisweet chocolate chips

6 tablespoons butter

3 eggs

1 cup white sugar

1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract

1/2 cups all-purpose flour

2 tablespoons unsweetened coco powder

1/4 teaspoon baking powder

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 cup semisweet chocolate chips

1 cup white sugar

1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract

- 1. In a microwave or metal bowl over a pan of Simmering water, melt unsweetened chocolate, 1 cup of Chocolate chips, and the butter stirring occasionally until smooth. Remove from heat and set aside to cool. In a large bowl, whip eggs, and sugar until thick and pale, about 2 minutes. Stir in the vanilla and chocolate mixture until well mixed. Combine the flour, cocoa, baking powder and salt; gradually stir into the chocolate mixture. Fold in remaining 1 cup chocolate chips. Cover dough and chill for at least an hour or overnight.
- 2. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Roll chilled dough into 1 inch balls. Place on ungreased cookie sheets so they are 2 inches apart.
- 3. Bake for 9 to 11 minutes in the preheated oven. Allow cookies to cool on baking sheet for 5 minutes before removing to a wire rack to cool completely. By: Pat Stanish
